- 1. Carry out chemical, biological and mechanical weed control under the direction of the Weed Control Coordinator
- 2. Carry out regular checks and maintenance on equipment including vehicles, spray equipment and tools according to capabilities as prescribed by the manufacturers' requirements
- 3. Follow instructions provided on herbicide labels and observe all health and safety requirements, follow all HRCC Safe Work Method Statements (SWMS) and contribute to any WH&S consultation process
- 4. Knowledge and application of a wide range of weed identification and weed control techniques
- 5. Carry out weed control operations in a professional, independent, expedient, accurate and safe manner
- 6. Implement, monitor and evaluate weed control programs
- 7. Maintain documentation and records relevant to the position including uploading data to a tablet
- 8. Supervise trainees and participate and assist in on-the-job training as required
- 9. Comply with all legislative requirements, such as:
 - Biosecurity Act 2015
 - Pesticides Act, 1999
 - Occupational Health and Safety Act 2011
 - Protection of the Environment Operations Act, 1997
 - National Parks and Wildlife Act, 1974
